Stage and Common Symptoms

Mild Alzheimer's (early-stage)

- Problems coming up with words or names
- Challenges performing tasks in social/work settings
- Forgetting material that one has just read
- Losing or misplacing a valuable object
- Increasing trouble with planning or organizing

Moderate Alzheimer's (middle-stage)

- Forgetting events or personal history details
- Unable to recall address or telephone number
- Confusion about where they are or what day it is
- Increased risk of wandering and becoming lost
- Personality or behavioral changes

Severe Alzheimer's (late-stage)

- Need 24/7 assistance with daily activities and care
- Loss of awareness of experiences and surroundings
- Increased difficulty communicating
- Vulnerable to infections, especially pneumonia
- Difficulties walking, sitting, and swallowing
